

David Rosetzky *Think of Yourself as Plural*, 2008

Sutton Gallery is pleased to present an exhibition of new work by David Rosetzky, *Think of Yourself as Plural*. Rosetzky has collaborated with critically acclaimed choreographer Lucy Guerin to craft the quiet and rhythmic movements throughout the central video work. Incorporating a series of intersecting scenarios; human behaviour, individuality and identity come under intimate observation in the piece. A series of related photographic collages will be exhibited alongside the video.

Think of Yourself as Plural continues Rosetzky's ongoing exploration of the ways in which personal and social identities intermingle. The layering of disjointed dialogue, narrative and movement points to a conflict between the protagonists' internal and external 'selves'. Interplaying themes of artifice, illusion, deceit and anxiety charge the work with a psychological intensity.

His most filmic work to date, *Think of Yourself as Plural* maintains Rosetzky's trademark technical and aesthetic precision, resulting in imagery that resembles the idealized visuals found in high end advertising and screen culture. With a single minded focus on themes of identity, subjectivity and community within the context of contemporary culture, Rosetzky has established a reputation as one of Australia's most innovative and compelling new media artists. *Think of Yourself as Plural* is a stunning addition to his nuanced and visually exquisite multidisciplinary practice.
